
Sunrise from the Hyuga-nada Sea

This journey involves a special nostalgic itinerary for the Seven Stars in Kyushu. On day one, guests leave Hakata Station for the retro Moji Station, and can enjoy a guided tour there. In the afternoon, guests can experience a traditional craft workshop from Oita. On day 2, guests can enjoy the tropical views of Miyazaki, together with the great expanses of nature and sea. Tonight, guests will stay at a ryokan in the Kirishima area. On day 3, guests can enjoy views of Mt. Sakurajima in Kinko bay, as the train heads into the Kagoshima area. While here, guests can visit the Sengan-en gardens, or visit a famous potter "Chin Jukan" kiln. On the final day, the train travels on the Hisatsu Line, and guests can enjoy views here which are the top 3 views from a train in Japan. This special journey travels through Fukuoka, Oita, Miyazaki, Kagoshima, and Kumamoto.

The Amorigawa River flows down from Mount. Kirishima. The hot springs have an abunlant output, meaning that there is no need

to add or store additional water. The meals here are in traditional Japanese multi-course style (kaiseki), utilizing seasonal locally produced ingredients.

Chin Jukan Kiln

For over 400 years in Kagoshima the Chin Jukan kiln has been producing Satsuma ware following the tradition of Joseon ceramics. Starting with




name has been passed down through the heads of the kiln to the current head, Chin Jukan XV. In this optional tour, after seeing the exhibits in the Chin Jukan Museum, passengers are able to experience Satsuma ware painting, and learn about its history.

Sengan-en gardens & "Shoko-Shuseikan"

Sengan-en was constructed by the Shimazu Clan, who used to rule Kagoshima for more than 700 years. The 19th head of the clan made the garden and house as a second home. The garden



is famous for how it uses Mt. Sakurajima and Kagoshima Bay as borrowed scenery. Guests can enjoy a tour of the garden, and a kaleidoscope workshop using pieces of Satsuma Kiriko glass.
